



Dr. Kendall K. Brown

October 3, 1963 - December 13, 2015

Dr. Kendall K. Brown, 52 of Union Grove died Sunday, December 13, 2015 in Marshall Medical Center North, Guntersville after a courageous battle with cancer.

Mr. Brown was born October 3, 1963 in Oklahoma, the son of Harry and Laura Reynolds Brown. He was a former resident of Washington and has since 1991 called Arab his home.

After high school graduation he continued his education, receiving his BS from Oklahoma State in Mechanical Engineering 1985, his Masters in Aeronautics and Astronautics at the University of Washington, 1991 and a PHD in Mechanical Engineering from UAH in 1996.

He received the Exceptional Engineering Achievement Medal in 2007 from NASA, the JANNAF Management award in 2015 from NASA. He was a retired Lieutenant Colonel in the Air Force Reserves, a Boy Scout Assistant Scout Leader for Troop 101 in Huntsville and a member of the Arab United Methodist Church.

He is survived wife: Robin Crow Brown; a son: Kevin Robert Brown; a daughter: Cecily Anne Brown; a brother and sister-in-law: Dennis and Sharon Brown, his other mother: Barbara Crow, his church family and many dear

friends; preceded in death by his parents: Harry and Laura Reynolds Brown.

Funeral service will be 11 a.m. Wednesday, December 16, 2015 at Arab First United Methodist Church, Brother Mike Mims and Reverend Steve West, officiating with eulogy by Alan Miller. Burial will be in New Friendship Cemetery, Arab Heritage Memorial Chapel, directing.

Pallbearers will be Brian Cooley, Scott Cooley, Jacob Crow, Phillip Crow, David Hall, Stacy Hollaway, Ted Monroe and David Tindall. Honorary Pallbearers will be the Boy Scout Troop 101, Dennis Brown, Tony Cooley, John Crow, Michael Crow and Rodney Crow.

“ Dear Brown Family –

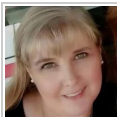
